Admission to B.A./B.Sc. (Honours & General) Courses, 2021

Important Dates:

- ❖ **Process of admission to B.A./B.Sc. (Honours & General) Courses, 2021 will start on and from 02.08.2021. For admission details and filling up forms visit the URL www.apccollege.ac.in and open the link “apply online” of “UG Admission 2021” tab. Please check the college website for regular updates also. The applications are to be submitted through online and no printed form will be available from the college.**
- ❖ **Online Application Forms for admission will be available from 02.08.2021 to 20.08.2021 upto 12 Midnight.**
- ❖ **Provisional Merit List (Subject-wise) will be published on 23.08.2021 in the College website.**

If any unintentional error like non inclusion of name or any other discrepancy is noted by the applicant or if the applicant has any academic enquiry regarding the above list, he/she may send a mail to that effect to ug.admission@apccollege.ac.in. The window for complaint/enquiry would remain open from the time of the publication of the Provisional List till 24.08.2021 Midnight. Any query/complaint received after this time will not be entertained.
- ❖ **Final Merit List (Subject-wise) will be published on 25.08.2021 in the College website.**
- ❖ **1st Merit List for Online Admission will be published on 25.08.2021. Admission will be made Online only on and from 25.08.2021 to 27.08.2021 (Midnight) by depositing the required course fees. Admission will be strictly on merit basis based on different merit list criteria defined in the website.**
- ❖ **2nd Merit List for Online Admission will be published on 30.08.2021 (if seats available). Admission will be made Online only on and from 30.08.2021 to 02.09.2021 (Midnight) by depositing the required course fees.**

- ❖ **3rd Merit List for Online Admission will be published on 04.09.2021 (if seats available). Admission will be made Online only on and from 04.09.2021 to 06.09.2021 (Midnight) by depositing the required course fees.**
- ❖ **4th Merit List for Online Admission will be published on 08.09.2021 (if seats available). Admission will be made Online only on and from 10.09.2021 to 12.09.2021 (Midnight) by depositing the required course fees.**
- ❖ **5th Merit List for Online Admission will be published on 15.09.2021 (if seats available). Admission will be made Online only on and from 15.09.2021 to 17.09.2021 (Midnight) by depositing the required course fees.**
- ❖ **Subsequent Merit List for Online Admission will be published (if seats available) and will be notified later.**
- ❖ **The college also runs BBA (Honours) which is a self-financing course. Interested candidates are requested to contact through ug.admission@apccollege.ac.in. This course being self financing, the college will not be in a position to run the course if the number of applicant is less than 50 and hence, no merit list for admission will be published for admission to this course. In that case the concerned candidates applied for would be intimated accordingly enabling him/her to fill-up the forms through admission portal.**

Application Procedure

Please read the following instructions carefully before starting the application process.

- a) Go to College website www.apccollege.ac.in and click on the “apply online” button on UG Admission 2021 tab.
- b) Applicants must have an active mobile number and an active email ID for online application. These should be preferably their own as all future communication from the College will be on this number/ email id.

1. Application Procedure:

Step 1: During application, applicants need to submit various kinds of information such as:

- Personal Details
- Guardian Details
- Qualifying Examination Details
- Courses Applied Details
- Contact Details

Once all inputs are saved, an application number with given password will be generated.

Step 2: Upload Testimonials/ Document(s): The applicant is required to upload scanned copies of his/her Photo, Signature and self attested (with date) photocopies of following documents in .jpg format only---

- 1) Mark Sheet of the Qualifying Examination (Higher Secondary [10+2] or other equivalent examination)
- 2) Age Proof Document (Birth Certificate or Admit Card showing date of birth)
- 3) Caste Certificate (for reserved category)
- 4) PWD Certificate from the appropriate authority (for physically challenged candidates)

Maximum size for uploading the following documents:

- Photograph & Signature within 20kb to 50kb each.
- Self-attested photocopies of Class 12 Mark Sheet & Age Proof Certificate within 100kb to 150kb each.
- All other self attested documents within 50kb to 100kb each.

Step 3: Application Fee Payment: There is no Application Fee for this session.

Step 4: Print / Download: The applicant is advised to print / download the following for future reference:

- Application Form
- Online Application Fee Payment Confirmation Receipt

2. Payment: All the payments related to admission for the session have to be made in online mode i.e., through Credit card/ Debit card/ Netbanking. Payment through Wallet is not enabled. After payment of application fees, the application process is final and complete. Please ensure that no mistakes are made during the process of filling up of the application form.

3. Applicant can apply more than one Honours and / or General courses. Each subject combination will be treated as a separate application.

An applicant may submit Application Forms for more than one (01) Honours course and/or General course preference wise. Choose one combination of Generic Subjects from the list, first one for 1st & 2nd Semester and second for 3rd & 4th Semester corresponding to the Honours subject applied for.

4. After the last date of submission of online application, a Provisional List (According to Merit) will be published on the college website. Please note that this list is published for the applicant to check the lists of respective categories (Gen/SC/ST/OBC/PWD) for respective streams and subjects and ensure that his/her application has been accepted and no inadvertent error has occurred in this respect.

If any unintentional error like non inclusion of name or any other discrepancy is noted by the applicant or if the applicant has any academic enquiry regarding the above list, he/she may send a mail to that effect to ug.admission@apccollege.ac.in. The window for complaint/enquiry would remain open from the time of the publication of the Provisional List till 11:59 pm the next day. Any query/complaint received after this time will not be entertained.

5. The college will require at least one day to solve the possible issues raised by applicants. Following this a Final Merit List will be published on the college website. The college will not entertain any further complaint/query after the publication of this list.

6. The Admission process will then start with publication of Merit List for Admission. The Merit Lists will be published on the college website in regular phases, according to availability of seats in each stream and subject. All concerned applicants are requested to check the college website REGULARLY (on a DAILY basis) for such information.

7. The applicants selected in the Merit List for Admission in all the phases of admission published on the college website will be informed through SMS and e-mail. However, for their own convenience all applicants must check the college website on the given date to see the Merit Lists for Admission in order to negate any room for error.

An applicant listed in the particular merit list MUST take admission in each phase of admission during in the stipulated time paying the Admission Fees online through the link given in the admission portal to complete the process. Failure to complete the admission through payment of admission fees by any selected applicant within the stipulated time will mean that the applicant will permanently lose his/her opportunity of getting admitted to the college.

8. Vacant seats on reserved categories (if any) will be filled up after de-reservation from competent authority. However, any vacancy seat of ST category can be filled up by candidate of SC category.

9. Students coming from the vocational stream can be considered for admission to B.A./B.Sc. (General) courses only.

10. Please note that all admissions done through the online system are provisional subject to physical verification of original documents by the College and approval of the University. All applicants are requested to be very careful while submitting relevant information and uploading of testimonials during the online process of application/admission. Verification of documents will be done only when the students report for the classes. Dates for verification will be notified later on college website. All the original documents should be produced at the time of verification. Admission will be cancelled if the documents are found not in conformity with the declaration in the form submitted online.

11. In case the applicant is already admitted to any other college/institute during the time of admission to this college, it would be his/her responsibility to cancel that admission at the earliest otherwise he/she will face serious problems at the time of University registration.

12. In case the applicant wishes to cancel his/her admission in this college, he/she is required to fill up the cancellation form and submit it online. Once the cancellation is approved by the college authority the applicant can take a print out of the cancellation receipt. For refund of the admission fee, the applicant is to provide his/her bank account details with cancellation receipt through e-mail at ug.admission@apccollege.ac.in. During the process of cancellation to be complete an OTP will be generated and sent to the registered mobile number of the applicant ONLY.

Criteria for Admission to Honours & General Course

The admission sub-committee formulates rules for admission following the guidelines of the University.

Regulations in respect of admission to degree courses (Honours, General)

Admission Qualifications

1. A candidate may be admitted to the first year of three-year B.A./B.Sc.(Honours/General) or BBA (Hons.) Courses of Studies on passing H.S. (10+2) Examination in General or Vocational Stream conducted by West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education **or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council, or Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya or National Open School** recognized by the Distant Learning Council subject to the fulfilment of the conditions mentioned below :

A candidate seeking admission shall have to pass in the last qualifying examination in five recognised subjects of full marks not being less than 100 each of which one shall be English. A candidate passing in four subjects shall not be eligible to such admission to the course.

Marks obtained in top four subjects shall be considered to ascertain the aggregate marks of a candidate passing the examination under grade system. Also for candidates passing the H.S. (10+2) Examination from the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education under old system, marks obtained in top four subjects shall be considered to determine the aggregate marks.

Marks obtained in Environmental Education as a compulsory subject at the H.S. (10+2) Examination conducted by the West Bengal Council of H.S. Education or its equivalent shall not be taken into account for calculating the aggregate marks in top four subjects for the purpose of admission at the degree course of studies under this University. However, 'Environmental Science' studied as an elective subject of 100 marks may be taken into account for calculating the aggregate marks.

Students of the (10+2) level passing out from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. C.B.S.E., I.S.C. and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not submit the Migration certificate for getting registration under this University.

2. No candidate shall be allowed for admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination or discontinuation of recognised regular courses of study after passing the previous qualifying examination.

Explanation : The year of admission will not be taken into account while calculating 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

3. **A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must obtain :**

(i) A minimum of 50% marks in aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

OR

(ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

OR

(iii) 50% marks in aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.

However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribe community taking up Honours Course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examinations, as the case may be.

4. For the B. A. or B.Sc. (Honours, General and Major) Courses of studies, a candidate is required to choose his/her Honours and two/three elective subjects (for details, see, course offered).

However, A candidate shall be allowed to take up the subject(s) under heading '(A)' if he/she has passed the subject(s) under heading '(B)' at the previous qualifying examination.

6. Some special conditions for admission to Honours Courses in Economics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Microbiology, Education, Philosophy, Anthropology, Botany and Zoology :

i) **Economics** : A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Economics if he/she has passed in Mathematics at the H.S. Examination (10+2) conducted by West Bengal Council of H.S. Education or its equivalent examination in Mathematics/Business Mathematics of ISC. Students who passed Business Economics including Business Math in H. S. (10+2) level from W.B. Council of H.S. Education are not eligible for admission in the Honours Course in Economics.

ii) **Mathematics** : A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Mathematics if he/she has passed in Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination. However, a candidate who has passed Business Mathematics is not eligible for admission to Mathematics Honours Course.

iii) **Chemistry** : A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Chemistry if he/she has passed Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.

v) **Microbiology** : A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Microbiology if he/she has passed the subject Physiology/Biology/Bio-technology and Chemistry in the previous qualifying examination.

Subject Combination offered for Microbiology in the College : Chemistry and any one of the following subjects : a) Physics, b) Zoology

v) **Philosophy** : The subject Psychology be treated as a related subject.

vi) **Anthropology** : The subject Biology be treated as a related subject. A candidate shall not be allowed to take up Anthropology along with Sociology.

vii) **Botany** : The subject Biology/Biotechnology be treated as a related subject.

viii) **Zoology** : The subject Biology/Biotechnology be treated as a related subject.

Criteria for some Honours Courses prescribed by the college

If a student wants to take **Honours in Electronics or Computer Science**, he/she must secure at least 45% marks in both Physics & Mathematics of full marks not being less than 100 each in the last qualifying examination. If a student wants to take a **Honours in Physics**, he/she must secure at least 45% marks in Mathematics of full marks not being less than 100 in the last qualifying examination. If a student wants to take up **Honours in Chemistry** he/she must secure at least 40% marks in both physics and **Mathematics** of full marks not being less than 100 each in the last qualifying examination.

A student willing to take Zoology / Botany Honours must have Chemistry as a subject in H.S. or equivalent Examination.

A student willing to take Zoology Honours must secure 50% in English in H.S. or equivalent Examination.

Students seeking admission to the 1st year degree classes should take note of the following :

- i) The last date for the submission of the admission forms should be rigidly maintained.
- ii) Merit list will be published on time and this will be followed by counselling by different departments. Time and day will be duly notified. The dates of counselling should be strictly maintained. The students who have decided their choice of subject after counselling must take their admission on the very day of counselling. If any deserving candidate's name is inadvertently left out from the list, he or she should immediately contact the Principal for rectification before the counselling.
- iii) In respect of admission the college authority reserves the right to make final decision without being answerable to any outside person, agency etc.
- iv) On the date of admission all the **ORIGINAL** documents should be produced.
- v) **All admissions are provisional.**

The admission of the S.C./S.T./O.B.C-A / O.B.C-B /Physically Challenged candidates is regulated by Government norms. Special consideration in admission may be made to those students having outstanding performance in games and sports. These candidates should furnish attested copies of S.C. / S.T. / O.B.C. certificate, issued by appropriate authority as per the latest Government Order. Physically Challenged Candidates must attach attested copies of relevant documents from the competent authority.

The Principal has the authority to reject any application for admission, without showing reasons, in the interest of the college.

Subject Combinations offered under Choice Based by the College

1. A candidate willing to take any B.A. / B.Sc. Honours subject has two choices of Generic electives for opting any one of the code against any Honours subject.
2. Candidates from B.A. / B.Sc. Honours course will study Generic Elective I in Semester I & II and Generic Elective II in Semester III & IV.
3. A candidate will be offered any one subject combination in B.A. / B.Sc. General Course under Science or Arts stream.

- ❖ Total Marks of the **Best FOUR Subjects** (at least 100 marks paper) excluding Environmental Studies & Environmental Education in the qualifying exam.
- ❖ Admission through Merit List based on Index Marks.
- ❖ Merit list is prepared based on Index Marks for all categories of candidates.
