

Journey of 61 Years

Acharya Prafulla Chandra College, a glorious educational institution founded on 16th August 1960, has completed its 60 years of journey. In 1960 it started its journey with rather modest steps but gradually picked up pace and has achieved the status of one of the best colleges in the district as well as the state. We are proud to have celebrated the Golden Jubilee completion of the college in 2010.

History

Acharya Prafulla Chandra College was founded on 16th August, 1960 under the Dispersal Scheme—with the joint participation of the State and Central Governments. Late Haripada Biswas was the founder secretary of this college. 'New Barrackpore College' was named as Acharya Prafulla Chandra College, after the name of an eminent visionary Acharya Prafulla Chandra Roy. This great educationist put stress on universal literacy & basic education; he advocated the concept of empowerment of women and wanted the development of indigenous industries through cultivation of entrepreneurial acumen of the educated youth. In the true spirit of Acharya Prafulla Chandra Roy, the college from its nascent state, has tried to propagate the ideals of this great man and the motto illustrates this; "Service, Knowledge, Sacrifice".

The partition of India witnessed a mass exodus of people of East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) to West Bengal. Among the many refugee colonies that sprang up, New Barackpore was one. Immediately after the need for food and dwelling was met, demand for eductional institutions arose. This resulted in the birth of this college with the initiative and endeavour of Late Haripada Biswas. The college had a very humble beginning with a handful of students starting their classes in a few rented rooms of New Barrackpore Colony Boys' High School. However, today's picture is one of complete transformation. Struggle is still there - but it is no more a simple struggle for survival but rather a constant endeavour to attain excellence.

Location

The college is situated on the Sodepur Road. The close proximity of the college to New Barrackpore and Madhyamgram railway stations has helped it draw students from far-flung areas of North 24 Parganas. Bus routes also conveniently connect the college with both Jessore Road and B. T. Road.

Mission

Today's Higher Education has witnessed a paradigm shift from elitist esotericism to common man's right to knowledge. This college is trying to adapt itself to this new way of thinking. The semi-urban location of the college caters to the needs of students who come from the grass-root level; some of them are even first-generation learners. The college is trying hard to set a pedagogic goal that is less hectoring and instructional and more learner-facilitating.

Towards This Mission

With this aim in mind the college is successfully running Degree Courses on 22 subjects both Honours and General, two Vocational / Major Courses, eight Post Graduate Courses in Microbiology, Electronic Science, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Bengali, History and Computer Science and two Distant Learning centres. The growing demands of the job market have prompted this college to introduce the study of the comparatively modern subjects. However, the college is equally keen in simultaneous teaching of the traditional subjects. Moreover, professional course like BBA is also operational.

The mode of Distance Education has received a great impetus in this area through the Netaji Subhas Open University Study Centre.

There is scope to study computer science in the college at three different levels. For students wanting to master the subject the college offers post graduate in Computer Science, Computer Science Honours; for those who would learn computer Science as an auxiliary, vocational discipline. Over and above the Institute of Computer Engineers (India) runs a computer centre named 'A.P.C. College Computer Centre' for all categories of students from inside and outside the institution. The courses here are tailor-made to meet the requirements of enterprising boys and girls.

So, the intention of the college is to harmonize the traditional and the experimental out look.

Achievements

NAAC Accreditation

Acharya Prafulla Chandra College is accredited with Grade 'A' by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) in 2016 with CGPA 3.23 in the Second Cycle.

During its long journey since 1960 the college had to pass several hurdles to provide higher education even to first generation learners. Gradually our wings spreaded. At present we offer twenty six courses at undergraduate level & eight courses at post graduate level. We do have two separate hostels for boys' & girls', auditorium, smart class room, well equipped seminar room, basket ball ground, gymnasium & a fairly large playground. Apert from academic carrier students are encouraged for sports, cultural activities & other community services like NSS. APC College was accredited by NAAC in the first cycle as B⁺⁺ in 2005. But over the years all the functionaries of the college worked hard and worked together to attain excellence. The cumulative effort and relentless work fetched the recognition the institution deserved in the second cycle of assessment by NAAC in the year 2016.

This College in its second cycle of NAAC assessment achieved a glorious feat by attaining grade 'A' with 3.23 grade point. It is now among one of the front running academic institutions in the state.

The Peer team from NAAC who assessed our college appreciated the overall performance of the college starting from Teaching-learning, Infrastructure and Learning Resources, Students Support and Progression down to Governance, Leadership and Management.

The Members of NAAC Peer Team in their report made special mention of two schemes in the college both of which provide financial assistance to the needy yet meritorious students.

One of these projects is run by the teachers in which a Students Benevolent Fund is generated by the monthly contributions of the teachers. Poor and meritorious students are given financial help from this fund.

The Peer team of NAAC highly praised the 'Medha britti Prakalpa' introduced by the students' union of APC College in the year 2014. Medhabritti Prakalpa is a Merit Scholarship Scheme for the meritorious but poor students. This scholarship is actually a tuition fee waiver for highest marks securing students of second year and third year classes for both B.A. and B.Sc. streams.

Publication

The college has taken the initiative to publish the collection of writings of Acharya Prafulla Chandra Roy in several volumes. In 2008 we ventured to publish the first volume entitled 'Acharya Prafulla Chandra Roy Rachana Sankalan' in two parts (Vol-I & Vol-IA in Bengali and English respectively). A year later it offered to be a co-publisher with Calcutta University to publish the second volume of the Rachana Sankalan in two parts (Vol-II & Vol-IIA in Bengali and English respectively). Third volume of 'Rachana Sankalan' in two parts (Vol-IIIA & Vol-IIIB) has been published by the Calcutta University which includes the reprints of A History of Hindu Chemistry (Vol-I & Vol-II) by Sir P. C. Ray. All these books are meticulously edited by Prof. Anil Bhattacharya. The college has taken initiative for publication of an academic journal for further strengthening of research and quality teaching.

New Vistas

Post Graduate

Post Graduate studies in Micorbiology, Electronic Science, Chemistry, Physics & Computer Science have been introduced in the college from the year 2004, 2005, 2008 and 2009 respectively. Post graduate courses in Bengali, History and Mathematics has been introduced in the college from the session 2017-18.

The Post Graduate Departments of Electronic Science and Microbiology are housed in the 1st & 2nd Floors of the VTG Block respectively. In addition to the well equipped laborataries for the under graduate courses in the above mentioned subjects, laboratary for each PG course with modern sophisticated instruments has been set up. The Departments of Physics & Computer Science are in the main building.

A separate library adjacent to the department caters to the needs of the Post Graduate students. Internet facilities are available both to the students and the faculty.

Modern teaching aids like OHP and LCD projectors are used in Post Graduate classes.

Quality improvement in teaching, particularly in Post Graduate studies, is not possible without research pursuit because research and teaching move hand in hand.

With this backdrop the college is formulating a strategy to initiate a Research & Development Cell for enhancing the need based research along with basic research. Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, has recommended our proposal for FIST programme of DST, 2011 and sanctioned a sum of 79.5 lakh for the scheme in 2012.

The college has procured a plot of land measuring about 2 bighas across the Sodepur Barasat Road, just opposite the existing campus, to establish a second campus for the Post Graduate departments. The construction of a two storeyed Post Graduate building is complete. Prof. Saugata Ray, Hon'ble MP & former Central Minister, Govt. of India has inaugurated the Post-Graduate Building.

- (g) An additional floor (3rd floor) on the existing three storied main building in the main campus is already complete.
- (h) An additional floor (3rd floor) over the entir Vocational Techenical block is almost complete with the fund from RUSA2.0.
- (i) Construction of a separate canteen building is nearing completion.

Recent infrastructural development of the college building & College Premises

With the endavour of the present Governing Body and cooperation of local M.P. and M.L.A., teachers, students and non-teaching staff along with the inhabitants of the locality following developmental works had been undertaken, most of which are already completed and others are in progress.

- 1. A "Prangan" named as Rabindra Prangan has been developed in the main campus of the college.
 - (a) Existing pond in the college with proper fencing and water bodies are preserved.
 - (b) A number of trees have been **planted in Medicinal plant** garden & maintained with care.
 - (c) A basket ball court has been constructed.
 - (d) In the **anterior part of the college there is a beautiful lawn** surrounded by seasonal flowers.
 - (e) The college provides sufficient parking space for motor cars, motor bikes and cycles.
- 2. Both the main campus and the second campus are under the surveillance of the **CCTV**.
- 3. Wi-Fi Network has been installed under Reliance Jio in both the campuses.
- 4. An air conditioned language lab with necessary software and modern aids.
- 5. The college has already initiated the process for the installation of solar panel grid for green power.



















































- 6. **Development of the college playground** has been undertaken with the necessary earth filling on the ditches and low lands of the ground to make it appropriate for atheleties and other outdoor games.
- 7. **Audio system and LCD projectors have been installed** in lecture theatres and galleries in both the campuses.
- 8. A virtual class room has been set up with the financial assistance from Higher Education department, Govt. of W.B.
- 9. An automatic weather monitoring station has been set up in the college premises under the supervision of the department of Geography.
- 10. A rain water harvesting system called 'Neeradhar' has been set up in the women's hostel to preserve rain water.
- 11. The college has a Language lab with modern software under the supervision of the department of English. This lab is for the use of development of communication skill of students of the college.

Library

Acharya Prafulla Chandra College Library came into existence along with the foundation of the college in 1960. It serves as the workshop for the entire college – students, faculty and other staff alike. Its aim is to support the teaching learning activity in the college and also provide the students updated knowledge and to ensure the optimum utilization of the available resources.

The Central library is situated on the first floor of the main building of college. It occupies about 3000 sq. ft. area and can accommodate about 50 students at a time in the reading room. The library is a great place to study and has silent, quite and group study area with proper ventilation, lightning & fans. Library staffs are always available to help and support the patrons.

Central Library has a well equipped e-learning room for browsing the online journals, books, databases and two computer terminals for searching the catalogue of library collection.

Library is partially computerised with the implementation of KOHA software and steps have been taken for the full automation of the library.

Students' Benefit & Support System

(a) Stipends & Free Studentship:

The college grants Free Studentship/Half-free Studentship to poor but meritorious students. Applications for Free Studentship must be addressed to the Principal in the prescribed form before a notified date. Boys and girls who have secured at least 50% and 45% marks respectively in the last qualifying examination are eligible to put in their application. At least 15% of the total students of the college are granted concession. Students from Scheduled Castes and Tribes as well as from Other Backward Classes and Minority Communities are entitled to special stipends. For this they have to properly fill in prescribed forms and send them through the Principal to concerned government officials authorized to release these grants.

But here is a word of caution. Students enjoying scholarships, stipends, Full-free /Half-free studentship may find their privileges withdrawn (i) if they show unsatisfactory academic progress or are guilty of misconduct; (ii) if they remain absent from college on grounds other than illness, and (iii) if they get involved in something that is likely to tarnish the name of the college, or misbehave with teachers or fellow students.

(b) Medhabritti Prakalpa of the Students' Union:

From 2014, the Students' Union also has introduced a Merit Scholarship Scheme for the meritorions but poor students. The highest marks securing students of second year and third year classes of both B.A. and B.Sc. streams will get a scholarship equivalent to six months' college fees.

(c) Student Safety Insurance Scheme:

The college has introduced Student Safety Insurance Scheme with United India Insurance Company from 11.12.2015 for UG students. This scheme provides insurance support to the policy holder in case of any accident as per the terms and conditions laid down in the policy. An Amount of Rs. 112.00 plus the service tax @14.5% is paid by each student towards the annual premium of this scheme.

(d) Remedial Coaching For SC/ST/OBC(non creamy layers) and Minority Remedial Coaching has been introduced during XIIth plan period of UGC to improve academic skills and strengthen knowledge of backward groups of SC, ST, OBC (non-creamy layer) and minority communities. Students belonging to these classes can take the benefit of these extra classes where the classes will be taken by the teachers of this college as well as retired teachers, research scholar and others. General students may also be allowed for such coaching classes if they need.

This coaching scheme has been started in this college in the academic session 2011-12. Approxmately 300 classes had been arranged for the academic session 2011-12 and almost 250 students had been enrolled themselves to join these

classes and got benefitted during the session 2011-12. This number has gone up to near 300 in the academic session 2012-13. The scheme was operative in 2014 at the same pace and it will work in 2015 in the same way. The remedial coaching is co-ordinated by Dr. Nazimul Hoque and Dr. Arabinda Das.

(e) Students' Benevolent Fund:

It aims at giving financial aids to poor and meritorious students and is funded by the teachers of this college.

(f) Hostel Facilities:

College has two hostels in its campus:

- (i) A women's hostel completed under UGC scheme (80 bedded).
- (ii) A central hostel for OBC boys (80 bedded) managed by the BCW department, government of West Bengal.

(g) Common Rooms:

There are separate common rooms for boys and girls. Facilities for indoor games are available here. They also get the scope of interacting and reading newspapers.

(h) Gymnasium:

College has a Gymnasium-cum-Auditorium. Students in the college avail the facilities of physical exercise with 16-station multigym equipment under the supervision of a trained Gym-Instructor.

(i) Playground:

The A. P. C. College enjoys the benefit of a remarkably large playground adjacent to the college.

(j) Health:

New Barrackpore Municipality Hospital provides medical assistance to our students as per requirment. Recently with the help of Dr. Baidyanath Chakraborty in august memory of his father, ambulance facilities have been made in the name of the St. John's Ambulance. Besides, arrangements for a sick room in the college have been made.

(k) College Canteen:

The college has a canteen to serve students.

(l) Campus Interview:

The college has been successful in arranging Campus Interviews for the students of the final year. So far many reputed companies have held such interviews and short listed probable recruits. Other reputed companies inside and outside the state are showing interest and might join this year.






Journals / Magazines:

The college observes the college foundation day (16th August) and the birthday of Acharya Prafulla Chandra Roy (August 2) in the presence of teaching, non-teaching staff and students every year.

It also observes 'Independence Day', 'Republic Day', 'Netaji's Birthday', 'Rabindra Jayanti', 'Women day', 'Mother language Day' and the birthday of Sirdar Ballav Bhai Patel every year by hoisting National Flag in the college premises in the presence of staff and students of the college.

Alumni:

The Alumni Association of Acharya Prafulla Chandra College ensures a steady interaction between the present students and those of the past. They extend this cooperation for the all over development of the college.

Internet & E-mail:

Almost all the departments, library and college office have access to internet. The website of our college is: www.apccollege.ac.in. The E-mail address of our college is: apc1960@apccollege.ac.in. Our college is now declaired as now free wi-fi zone.

Honours & General Courses

The admission sub-committee formulates rules for admission following the guidelines of the University. (For guidelines, see **Annexure**). The admission of the S.C./S.T./O.B.C-A / O.B.C-B /Physically Challenged candidates is regulated by Government norms. Special consideration in admission may be made to those students having outstanding performance in games and sports.

Procedure:

- a) Attested copies of S.C. / S.T. / O.B.C. Certificate should be furnished, issued by appropriate authority as per the latest Government Order. Physically Challenged Candidates must attach attested copies of relevant documents from the competent authority.
- b) Students seeking admission to the 1st year degree classes should take note of the following:
 - i) The last date for the submission of the admission forms should be rigidly maintained.
 - ii) Merit list will be published on time and this will be followed by counselling by different departments. Time and day will be duly notified. The dates of counselling should be strictly maintained. The students who have decided their choice of subject after counselling must take their adminission on the very day of counselling. If any deserving candidate's name is inadvertently left out from the list, he or she should immediately contact the Principal for rectification before the counselling.
 - iii) In respect of admission the college authority reserves the right to make final decision without being answerable to any outside person, agency etc.
 - iv) On the date of admission all the **ORIGINAL** documents should be produced.
 - v) All admissions are provisional.

Migration

Students coming from other universities / other states or outside India, if admitted, must produce a Migration Certificate within One Month of Admission.

The students from Bangladesh (who fulfil the criteria) may be admitted provided they obtain Indian Citizenship Certificate or produce students' visa issued by appropriate authority. Proper evidence should be furnished during the time of admission.

The Principal has the authority to reject any application for admission, without showing reasons, in the interest of the college.

Regulations for Admission to the Six Semester B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Honours and General) and B.Mus. (Honours and General) Courses of Studies effective from the Academic Session 2018-2019 under Choice Based Credit System.

1. Admission Qualifications:

A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent examination is eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of the Six Semester B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Hons. and Genl.) or B.A. Music. (Hons. and Genl.) Course of studies provided he/she has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100.

In any case, where there is an ambiguity regarding the admissibility of a particular examination at the Higher Secondary (10+2) level of study, the matter shall be referred to the Equivalence Committee of the University who shall determine the eligibility of the said examination.

However, no candidate, in general, shall be allowed for admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. Those desirous to do so will seek permission from the University Authority.

The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

However, in exceptional cases a candidate, may be allowed for admission after 3 years of the previous qualifying examination but within 3 years after discontinuation of a recognized regular Course of Study. Those desirous to do so will seek permission from the University Authority.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the Honours Course, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks of **top four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate**. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. If the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

2. Eligibility Condition

- 2(a) A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:
 - i) A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination. In case of B.Mus. (Hons.) 45% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject Music in the prequalifying examination.

OR

ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

OR

iii) 50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all the other clauses are satisfied.

However, if in any Honours subject, the number of applications are so low that even the permitted intake of the colleve cannot be filled up, then the Principal may use his discretionary power to reduce the minimum requirement for admission in that subject. A written note in that respect should reach the Registrar for consideration of that decision for a final approval by the University and the decision will be communicated to the Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal for information.

2 (b) However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe Community taking up Honours Course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.

3. Candidates from other Boards

- 3(a) Students, who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils or State Boards/Councils including Open Schools and vocational studies, are eligible for study at the UG level.
- 3(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) are not required to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.
- 3(c) Any dispute regarding eligibility criteria would be resolved by the Equivalence Committee set up by the University or by the Executive Council in its absence.

4. Choice of Courses

- 4(a) For the B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose his/her Honours in a discipline and two other disciplines for Generic Elective courses, from among Group-I to Group-VIII as follows by taking not more than one disciplines from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:
- 4(b) For the B.Sc. (General) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose three disciplines from among Group-I to Group-VIII as follows by taking not more than one disciplines from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:
- 4(c) For the B.A. (General) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose two main disciplines and for Generic Elective courses the student is required to choose a third discipline, from among Group-I to Group-VIII as follows by taking not more than one disciplines from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:

Groups of disciplines:

Gr. I : Physics, Zoology, Education, Film Studies, Physical Education, Human

Rights, Women Studies.

Gr. II : Mathematics, Development, History, Environmental Science

Gr. III : Chemistry, Sociology, Defense Studies, Music, Arabic, Sanskrit, Bio-

chemistry.

Gr. IV : Botany, Economics, Food and Nutrition.

Gr. V : Political Science, Electronics.

Gr. VI : Geography, Molecular Biology, Psychology, Philosophy, Microbiology,

Journalism & Mass Communication.

Gr. VII : Statistics, Physiology, English.

Gr. VIII: Anthropology, Computer Science, Bengali, Hindi, Urdu.

5. Mandatory Subject Requirement (at H.S. level)

A candidate shall be allowed to take up the subject(s) under heading '(A)' if he/she had passed the subject(s) under heading '(B)' at the previous qualifying examination.

6. Some Special conditions for admission to Honours Courses as follows :

To take up Honours in any subject, the candidate has to pass in that "subject" or "any related subject" in the H.S. examination. In the above table, in general, "subject" and "related subject" are given under the columns A and B. However, the following restrictions supersede the previous clause.

- (i) For B.Com. (Honours) Course, the word "subject" or "related subject" shall mean exactly the same list as given in Serial No. 13 under Column B above.
- (ii) **Economics:** A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Economics if he/she has passed in Mathematics at the H.S. or its equivalent Examination. However, it is advisable that a student pursuing Honours in Economics takes Mathematics as a Generic Elective (for pursuing higher studies in the subject in future).
- B. A student shall be given B.Sc. Honours degree in Economics if he/she takes up at least one discipline from the Science group for his/her Generic Elective (as given in sec 7a) and shall be awarded B. A Hons. degree in Economics if both the disciplines chosen for Generic Electives are from the Arts & Humanities group (as given in Sec 7b)

A student will be given B.Sc. degree in Economics if he/she earns required number of credits in the structure appropriate for B.Sc. General and chooses at least one discipline from science group besides economics.

A student will be given B.A. degree in Economics if he/she earns required number of credits in the structure appropriate for B.A. General and chooses the other main discipline (and not the Generic Elective) from Arts & Humanities group besides economics.

- (iii) **Mathematics:** a candidate, who has passed Mathematics (and not Business Mathematics) at H.S. level, is eligible for admission to Mathematics Honours course. A student will only be given the B.Sc. degree for Mathematics subject. It is mandatory for the student to choose both the subjects from the Science group (as given in sec 7a) to be eligible for the aforesaid degree.
- (iv) **Bio-Chemistry:** Students studying Honours in Biochemistry will have to take elective suvbjects as stand hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects: (a) Any one of the subjects: Physics / Mathematics / Statistics

.

- (b) Any one of the subjects: Zoology / Botany / Microbiology / Physiology / Molecular Biology
- (v) **Microbiology:** Students studying Honours in Microbiology will have to take elective subjects from the following list:

 Chemistry and Mathematics / Physics / Botany / Zoology / Physiology
- (vi) **Anthropology:** Students pursuing Honours in Anthropology should take Generic Elective disciplines from the Science Group (as given in sec 7a).
- (vii) **Education/Sociology**: Subjects Psychology, Philosophy, Mathematics, Sociology, Education, Economics, Political Science, History be treated as related subject.
- (viii) **Philosophy**: Subject Psychology is a related subject.
- (ix) **A. Food and Nutrition:** A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Food and Nutrition if he/she has passed in Chemistry at the H.S. Examination and has to take up **Chemistry as one of the elective subject.**

A student will only be given the B.Sc. degree for Food and Nutrition subject. It is mandatory for the student to choose both the subjects from the Science group (as given in sec 7a) to be eligible for the aforesaid degree.

- (x) **Physics:** Students studying Honours in Physics will have to take elective subjects as stand hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects:
- (a) One of the subjects: Mathematics and
- (b) Any one of the subjects: Chemistry, Electronics, Statistics, Computer science
- (xi) **Electronics:** Students studying Honours in Electronics will have to take elective subjects as stand hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects: One of the subjects: Mathematics. The other subject has to be choosen from: Physics and Computer Science.

However, it is advisable that a student pursuing Honours in Electronics takes Mathematics and Physics as Generic Elective (for pursuing higher studies in the subject in future).

(xii) **Geography:** A student will only be given the B.Sc. Honours degree for Geography subject. Students studying Geography will have to take **two disciplines as generic** elective subjects from the disciplines mentioned hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects:

Mathematics, Statistics, Computer Science, Economics, Political Science, Zoology, Anthropology

(xiii) **Computer Science:** Students studying Honours in Computer Science will have to take Generic Elective subjects as stand hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects:

Two disciplines from the following list:

Physics, Mathematics, Statistics, Electronics

7. Divisions of Honours and General subjects B.A./B.Sc. :

a) Arts & Humanities:

History, English, Bengali, Hindi, Urdu, Political Science, Sanskrit, Pali, Philosophy, Sociology, Education, Arabic, Journalism & Mass Communication, Music, Physical Education, Human Rights, Film Studies.

b) Science:

Physics, Zoology, Chemistry, Botany, Psychology, Mathematics, Molecular Biology, Statistics, Microbiology, Anthropology, Geography, Physiology, Economics, Defence Studies, Computer Science, Electronics, Biochemistry, Physical Education, Environmental Science, Food and Nutrition, Agriculture & Rural Development.

c) Home Science:

Human Development, Social Science.

8. A candidate taking up Honours in B.A. Degree Course shall study:

- i) Honours in any one subject of the Humanities Group, which shall consist of 14 core courses (ACOR) and any two other subjects as Generic Elective Courses (HGEC) which shall consist of 4 courses (two courses from each discipline) taking at leat one from Humanities Group.
- ii) In addition to i) above, a candidate also has to do 4 courses in Discipline Specific Elective (ADSE) in his/her chosen Honours subject area.
- iii) However, that other things remaining the same, a candidate may take up Honours course in B.A. in the following subjects without taking any elective subject from the Group of Science/ Home Science:
 - a) Psychology, b) Economics

9. A candidate taking up General Course of study for the B.A. Degree shall study:

- i) Any two subjects from the Humanities Group, which shall consist of 8 core courses (GCOR) taking 4 courses from each discipline. In addition the candidate has to do 2 core courses in English language (ENGLCOR) and two core courses in Modern Indian Language (XXXLCOR).
- ii) The candidate also has to choose 4 courses in Discipline Specific Elective (GDSE) in his/her above chosen 2 subject areas.
- iii) The candidate also has to choose two courses from one subject (other than the subjects chosen above under sec 10.1) as a Generic Elective Course (GGEC).

10. A candidate taking up Honours Course for B.Sc. Degree shall study:

- i) Honours in any one subject of the Science Group, which shall consist of 14 core courses (ACOR) and any two other subjects as Generic Elective Courses (HGEC) which shall consist of 4 courses (two courses from each subject) taken from the Science Group.
- ii) In addition to i) above, a candidate also has to do 4 courses in Discipline Specific Elective (ADSE) in his / her chosen Honours subject area.
- iii) However, that other things remaining the same, a candidate may take up Honours course in the B.Sc. in the following subjects by taking at least one Generic Elective subject from the Group of Science / Home Science.

 a) Psychology, b) Economics.

11. A candidate taking up General course for the B.Sc. Degree shall study:

- i) Any three subjects from the Science Group / Home Science Group which shall consist of 12 core courses (GCOR) taking 4 courses from each subject.
- ii) The candidate also has to choose 6 courses in Discipline Specific Elective (GDSE) in his/her above chosen 3 subject areas.
- iii) However, that other things remaining the same, a candidate may take up General course in B.Sc. in Economics General if the candidate chooses any one subject from the Science / Home Science Group.

12. A candidate taking Honours course in B.Com degree shall study:

- i) Honours in any one subject of the Comerce Group, shall consist of 14 core courses (ACOR) and any two other subjects as Generic Elective Courses (HGEC) which shall consist of 4 courses (two courses from each subject) taken from the Commerce Group.
- ii) In addition to 13 i) above, a candidate also has to do 4 courses in Discipline Specific Elective (ADSE) in his/her chosen Honours subject area.

13. A candidate taking General Courses in B.Com. degree shall study :

- i) Any two subjects from the Commerce Group, which shall consist of 8 core courses (GCOR) taking 4 courses from each subject. In addition the candidate has to do 2 core courses in English language (ENGLCOR) and two core courses in Modern Indian Language (LCOR).
- ii) The candidate also has to choose two courses from one subject (other than the subjects chosen above under sec 14.1) as a Generic Elective Course (GGEC).
- iii) The candidate also has to choose 4 courses in Discipline Specific Elective (GDSE) in his/her above chosen 2 subject areas.

14. A candidate taking General Course in B.Com./B.A./B.Sc. degree shall study:

- i) In addition to what has been mentioned above a candidate under the General stream has to complete two courses under Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course. One such course shall be in Environmental Science (ENVSAEC) and the other course will be communicative course either in English (ENGSAEC) or any Modern Indian Language (MIL) (SAEC).
- ii) The candidate also has to study 4 Skill Enhancement courses (SEC) from any subject of his choice across the different disciplines offered by the institute where he/she is studying.

15. A candidate taking Honours Course in B.Com./B.A./B.Sc. degree shall study:

- i) In addition to what has been mentioned above a candidate under the Honours stream has to complete two courses under Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course. One such course shall be in Environmental Science (ENVSAEC) and the other course will be communicative course either in English (ENGSAEC) or any Modern Indian Language (MIL) (SAEC).
- ii) The candidate also has to study 2 Skill Enhancement courses (SEC) from any subject of his choice across the different disciplines offered by the institute where he/she is studying. Paper code for the courses will be SSEC.

16. Interdisciplinary Subjects:

Any B.A./B.Com. Student can choose any Science subject as a HGEC or GGEC fourse and all such candidates shall be admitted on the basis of the admission Test/Screening to be conducted by the College Authority Concerned to assess the aptitude of the candidate in the relevant subject.

17. Post-admission Stipulations:

- i) Colleges have the freedom to hold any number of tests and examinations of its own students. However, Colleges will not hold any elimination/qualifying test in the midway for students admitted to the different Course of Studies.
- ii) The evaluation and assessment pattern under CBCS system will be regulated as per provisions of the regulation which will be in force at eh time of the said examination. Any dispute regarding the above would be resolved by the relevant Examination rules and regulations set up by the University or by the Executive Council.
- iii) It is expected that the semester examinations will be held every six months as per the academic calender which will be duly intimated in advance by the University.

18. BBA (Bachelor of Business Administration) :

- The minimum qualification for admission to the 1st year of the B.B.A. course shall be a pass in Higher Secondary (General/Vocational) from West Bengal Council of Secondary Education or any other equivalent qualification recognized by the West Bengal State University with at least 55% marks for General Candidates (50% for S.C./S.T. Candidates). There shall be no common Admission Test: instead College(s) shall hold group discussions followed by interview for such admission. There shall be option to the colleges for holding Written Admission Test.
- ii) The medium of instruction for the B.B.A. course shall be English and candidates will have to answer the examination papers in English only.
- iii) B.B.A. Course shall be a 6 semester course extending over three academic years.

19. Foreign Nationals:

The candidate (Foreign Nationals) will have to show "Original Copy" of Certificate of Madhyamik (or equivalent), Certificate of Higher Secondary (or equivalent) and original Passport (along with Visa) at the time of admission. Foreign Nationals will have to pay the fees five times higher than the Indian Nationals.

20. College Transfer:

Transfer of candidates from one affiliated college to another will be possible as per the provisions laid out in the regulation of CBCS system which will be in force at the relevant time. However, in all cases such transfers will be efected after due approval of the application of the candidate concerned alongwith requisite non refundable fees to the University administration without

contravening the provisions of the Regulation inforce. The University reserves the right to approve or reject such applications of transfer and it cannot be treated as a matter of right on behalf of the applicant concerned.

21. Re-admission:

In case of discontinuation of Studies, the candidate concerned can be permitted only fresh admission with the issuance of new Registration (in cancellation of the earlier registration) after submission of an affidavit from a 1st class Judicial Magistrate that he/she has not taken admission under any other University / Institution in the intervening period. All such cases of fresh admission have to be preceded with the cancellation of earlier registration. For all such re-admission the provisions fo this regulation in consonance with the Act and Statute of the University and the guidelines issued by the West Bengal Higher Education Council from time to time should be followed.

22. Completion of UG Course:

As per UGC norms, a candidate has to complete the Under Graduate Course (6 semester) within 5 years (five years) from the date of Registration:

- i) A student enrolled for a Honours degree of the University shall be awarded the same if he/she completes a total course of 140 credits alongwith the mandatory satisfactory completion of the different courses under the said course for the aforesaid degree.
- ii) A student enrolled for a General degree of the University shall be awarded the same if he/she completes a total course of 120 credits alongwith the mandatory satisfactory completion of the different courses under the said course for the aforesaid degree.
- 23. The admission to the UG courses under CBCS regulations shall be followed strictly on the basis of the aforesaid provisions. However, in cases where the provisions fail to claify any regulation or is ambiguous in its interpretation, the matter shall be referred to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor whose decision in the said matter would be final. The Vice Chancellor's decision shall be comunicated to the Executive Council of the University.
- 24. For all admission and re-admission cases, the provisions of this regulation in consonance with the Act and Statute of the University, guidelines issued by the West Bengal Higher Education Council and Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal from time to time should be strictly followed.

NOTIFICATION

It is notified for all concerned, that those Under Graduate Students who have cleared their 10+2 Course during the *period 2012 to 2014 with break in studies and now willing to continue studies may get admitted in the Under Graduate Courses in the Academic Session 2018-19.* The admission is strictly Provisional Admission in the

B.A/B.Sc./B.Com./B.Mus and other Under Graduate Courses only, strictly in compliance with the Regulation of Admission of the University and the intake capacity of the college. The college admitting such students must get University endorsements within one month prior from the last date of admission. The University shall take the final decision regarding regularity of the provisional admission and convey the same to the concerned college accordingly.

The Criteria for Admission to B.A. & B. Sc. (Major) Degree Course:

- 7. A candidate who secures a minimum of 45% marks in the aggregate at the H.S. (10+2) or in an equivalent examination shall be eligible for admission to B.A./ B.Sc./B.Com. (Major) Degree Course of Studies provided he/she has passed the said examination with 5 recognised subjects of which at least one is English carrying not less than 100 as full marks.
- 8. However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe community taking up Major Course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examinations, as the case may be.

Criteria for some Honours Courses prescribed by the college

If a student wants to take **Honours in Electronics or Computer Science**, he/she must secure at least 45% marks in both Physics & Mathematics of full marks not being less than 100 each in the last qualifying examination. If a student wants to take a **Honours in Physics**, he/she must secure at least 45% marks in Mathematics of full marks not being less than 100 in the last qualifying examination. If a student wants to take up **Honours in Chemistry** he/she must secure at least 40% marks in both physics and **Mathematics** of full marks not being less than 100 each in the last qualifying examination.

A student willing to take Zoology / Botany Honours must have Chemistry as a subject in H.S. or equivalent Examination.

A student willing to take Zoology Honours must secure 60% in English and Biology in H.S. or equivalent Examination. Educational Excursion is mandatory in this subject.

NPTEL

In recent years the Govt. of India is laying a lot of stress the reach of quality education through SWAYAM - its MOOCS based platform. The aim is to allow students to enhance their knowledge, skill-base and thereby their employability by undergoing certification courses in parallel with their education through the formal system. The **National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning** (NPTEL) is one such initiative funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), providing learning materials in science and engineering through online Web and Video courses in Engineering, Sciences, Technology, Management and Humanities. This is a joint initiative by seven IITs and IISc Bangalore. Other selected premier institutions also act as Associate Partner Institutions. The NPTEL video lectures series is one of the most subscribed educational channels on Yutube.

Certification Programs: NPTEL contents are being used by various educational institutions as part of their teaching-learning process. Certification courses are offered by NPTEL in association with industry partners like Aricent, NASSCOM and Google. Currently, 159 courses are available for certification. Exams are being conducted twice a year which aim at bridging the gap between academia and industry. BENEFITS OF NPTEL – Besides the obvious advantage getting a certification from IIT which will add value to your CV it also offers a lot of other benefits like (i) **INTERNSHIPS** in Research laboratories for course toppers, in companies (in collaboration with Internshala) (ii) GATE Preparation using NPTEL Material: GATE (Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering) is IIT's competitive entrance exam for Master's and Doctoral programs across India. NPTEL provides GATE question papers and mock tests on its official website nptel.ac.in. Previous 3-year question papers with reference to NPTEL content are available. Practice tests (without solution) are also available for students that mimic the actual online exam pattern (iii) **INDUSTRY-ACADEMIA Tie-up** - NPTEL has tie-ups with companies like IBM, TCS whereby performers scoring a minimum percentile in certain courses (fulfilling other academic criteria) will get an automatic call for OFF-CAMPUS interviews. Some of the courses are also designed by them.

A.P.C. Local Chapter of NPTEL

We have opened a Local Chapter of NPTEL in our college in 2017. Over the past two years a fair number of undergraduate and postgraduate students have successfully completed various courses. The local chapter will allot a faculty member as your mentor to guide you through your assignments, doubt clearing etc.

International seminar on Recent Trends In Science Towards Sustainable Development

The college organised a two days international seminar on Recent Trends In Science Towards Sustainable Development in In Collaboration withIndian Chemical Society and sponsored by the Department of Biotechnology on the 6th and 7th of august 2019. Some Relevant Information: General Rules

a) A candidate shall be deemed to have prosecuted a regular course of study for each part of the B.A./B.Sc/ Honours/Major/General Degree course in an affiliated college/institution when he/she has attended at least 75% of the lectures delivered and 75% of practical classes separately held there in each of the subjects/groups of subjects concerned.

A candidate attending less than 75% but not below 60% of the lectures delivered and practical classes held in one or more subjects/groups of subjects shall be declared "Non-Collegiate" and may be allowed to appear at the concerned examination on payment of requisite Non-Collegiate fee.

A candidate attending less than 60% lectures delivered and practical classes held in one or more subjects/groups of subjects shall be declared "Discollegiate" and shall be debarred from appearing in the examination.

- b) Examinations are to be held as per University Guideline.
- c) Teacher-student-guardians' meetings are conducted by the departments.
- d) Interaction of the students and teachers is an essential feature of this institution.
- e) The administration of the college patronizes the student feedback system for the quality control in imparting of education.
- f) For healthy maintenance of the work atmosphere a Grievance Redressal Cell is operative in the college.
- g) Students are supposed to go for excursion as per curriculum.

Some Necessary Information:

i. Issue of Identity Cards:

Date of issue of Identity Card will be notified on the college Notice Board. If the Identity Card is lost, the Principal must be immediately informed. A new Identity Card may be issued on payment of Rs. 20.00. No student is allowed to enter the college premises without his /her Identity Card.

ii. Withdrawal and Transfer Certificate:

If a student wishes to withdraw his name from the college rolls, he will have to inform the Principal at least a week before the date; he will have to secure clearances from the departments and the Library of the college, and these are to be attached to the application form. The student will have to pay all the college fees including that for the month in which the Transfer Certificate is issued. Admission to any other educational institutions will remain invalid until a proper Transfer Certificate has been obtained.

General rules about discipline and conduct:

Prohibition of Ragging

According to the UGC Regulations (No: UGC-Rag/C/96(15)/SCHE/2009) circulated on April 13, 2009, ragging in Higher Educational Institutions is strictly prohibited and totally banned, and anyone found guilty of ragging is liable to be punished in any one or more than one way mentioned below:

- a) Cancellation of admission
- b) Suspension from attending classes
- c) Withholding/Withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
- d) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
- e) Withholding results
- f) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- g) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- h) Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semisters
- i) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution
- j) Fine of Rs. 25000/-
- k) Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective pubishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.
